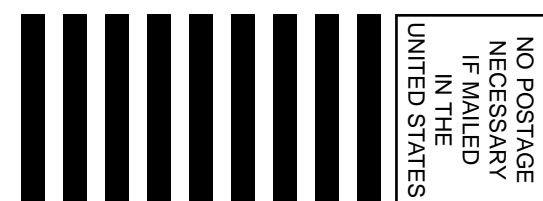

Financial Aid

Provided to assist students who, without such aid, would find it difficult to attend college successfully. Over 31% of students receive financial assistance in grants, loans, work-study programs, and a variety of scholarships and other awards.

Veterans Affairs

A full-time Coordinator of Veterans Affairs is available on both main campuses to provide information and forms for eligible persons to apply for benefits.

Tech Prep

A program of study that combines, at minimum, two years of secondary education with two years of post-secondary education. Articulation coordinates high school courses with post-secondary programs to allow students to take courses in high school that may eliminate the need to take some introductory college courses. It assures students a seamless transition into college or technical school.



Upward Bound:

A pre-college educational program to assist students in their efforts to successfully complete high school and obtain a college education. Participants are provided with comprehensive educational services that are specifically designed to enhance learning and self-confidence.

Campus Security:

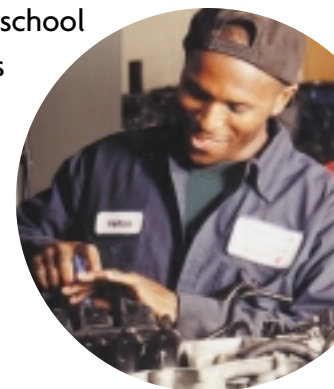
